

**REGULAR MEETING  
TREMONT VILLAGE BOARD  
February 1, 2010**

President Todd Bong called to order this regular meeting of the Tremont Village Board at 7:00 PM, Monday, February 1, 2010, at the Tremont Village Hall.

**MINUTES**

Trustee Zuercher moved to approve the minutes for the regular January 18 meeting, and Replogle seconded.

**BILLS**

Trustee Scott moved to approve all bills incurred since the January 18 meeting, and Zuercher seconded.

President Bong announced that he, and Trustees Harding and Scott will meet Tuesday night with a representative from Aaron Schock's office regarding the possible acquisition of stimulus funds with work on the water tower and community center in mind. Also, Trustee Scott handed out information concerning a hike in the sewer charge citing fees used in surrounding communities. Trustees were urged to look over these figures and possibly take action at the next regular Board meeting.

Trustee Zuercher reported that the January Police activity report is available to interested trustees. Zuercher also reported problems with the police vehicles and the need for a computer upgrade in the squad cars by August.

Police Chief Mike Dodwell submitted for review ideas concerning penalties and fees (payable at the Village Hall) for violations such as unauthorized burning, curfew, tobacco possession, disorderly conduct, and parking. After Board review by the February 15 meeting, updated ordinances can and may be ordered by the Board.

President Bong reported that he had met with Trustee Replogle, Ric Creasy, Don Beard, Jeff Hinman and IDOT officials regarding a turn lane at the High School. The group is still awaiting

important information before action may be taken. Bong also informed the Board that Route 9 will be resurfaced later this year from Chestnut Street to Pekin.

Finally, President Bong said a decision is being discussed regarding a Handicapped Loading Zone across from the Fire Department as a result of a conversation with an interested citizen.

Trustee Harding moved to transfer \$17,245.01 from General Savings to Police Operations to cover bills and payroll. Zuercher seconded.

Also, Harding moved to transfer \$595.20 from Motor Fuel Tax Fund to General Savings for partial payroll. Scott seconded.  
AYES: All NAYS: None Motion carried.

Finally, Trustee Harding said that Financial Reports are in and handed out to all Trustees.

Mike Pflederer was in attendance to present some drawings made by architect Joseph Kelly of layouts for the new community building and ideas for the old drug store.

Following an introduction of Tim and Tracie Perdue who will be taking over the establishment formerly known as Spotters, Trustee Replogle moved to grant the Perdues a Class A Liquor License. Zuercher seconded.

In final business, Trustee Zuercher moved not to release any closed session minutes taken from July 1 through December 31, 2009. Replogle seconded.
