First American Degree

The dedication to pursue your dreams, the work ethic to make them happen, or the ambition to meet new friends can lead to positive outcomes. There's one FFA member who has driven himself to the limit on reaching the stars.

Born and raised in Tremont, Logan Sauder's success for winning the highest honor in FFA has brought him to the front page in this article. FFA stands for Future Farmers of America, a student organization for those interested in agriculture and leadership.

What makes the American Degree so special? Sauder earned the highest degree recognition an FFA member can achieve in the nation. It is based on hours worked and wage earned at one's job. He received this award Nov. 1, 2019 at the National Convention held in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Some of the many requirements of this award are completing three years or 540 hours of high school agriculture classes, completing 50 hours of community service, and graduating high school one year prior to the National Convention.

Interesting fact: Sauder is the first person in the Tremont chapter to receive an American Degree.

While working towards earning this award, Sauder faced some challenges, one of which was bookkeeping.

"Working hard long hours is no problem, but remembering to keep track of it all was a challenge," Sauder said.

Angie Bane, Tremont High School teacher and director of the FFA chapter, has watched Sauder grow.

"It has boosted his work ethic, timely completion of tasks, and his socialization skills," Bane said.

Luke Sauder, Sauder's younger brother, agreed saying "I believe Logan deserves this award not just as a brother, but because of all the hard work he's put in for this very moment."

One thing Sauder was taught is that giving up is never an option. Even looking back, Sauder has seen much growth compared to when he started as a freshman in high school. As for us? The dedication, work ethic, and ambition are all you need for a successful life.
