Turk Football

2002... That is the last time the Tremont Turks won the conference in football. Now it's 2019 and coach Zach Zehr plans to change that.

The Turks missed the playoffs by 1 playoff point last year with a record of 5-4. A gut-wrenching way to end the season. The team is now refueled, reignited, and plans to leave last season in the past and make a playoff push this year.

The Turks got off to a red-hot start with wins over their Route 9 rivals, Dee-Mack Chiefs, and the Fisher Bunnies before losing to Fieldcrest, a top ranked team in the state. They pulled out a win against Le Roy on the road, followed by a tough loss to El-Paso Gridley that had some people doubting the Turks. They were quickly silenced after a win the following week against Ridgeview/Lexington.

The stars of the show this year are the starting seniors for the Turks: Caiden Buster, Kendall Ehnle, Nathan Hately, Nathan Nguyen, and Landon Pflederer. All five have been spectacular this year while battling injuries during the course of the season. Nguyen notes what makes this team different than last year.

"Resilience, we have been able to fight through injuries and stay in some games even when we aren't 100%," Nguyen said.

Nguyen's remark says something about the character of this team. The Turks finished the season going 6-3 and making the playoffs. This was the first goal for the Turks going into the season and they accomplished it. Now their next goal... winning their first playoff game. How will they fair in the playoff run as this season grows longer?

"I'm confident that this team can keep grinding and win some big games in the playoffs and make our season longer than what people expected of us," Pflederer said.

This is not the same team as in years past. What is it that separates this team from the past years? A piece of the puzzle is Zehr.

"When I talk to other coaches from our conference, they all describe us as a very physical team," Zehr said.

Entering his third year as the head football coach, this will be the first time leading the Turks to the playoffs. Quite the accomplishment, but Zehr knows this team is not finished yet and still has a lot of work to do.

Did you Know...?

THE TREMONT TURKS

Most Tremont residents probably are aware that several Tremont area farms raised turkeys at one time in Tremont. The Sinn family still raise turkeys commercially. So of course, that is why our high school sports team is known as the Tremont Turks. Except. There is more to the story.

Ernest "Ernie" Getz was considered one of the pioneer turkey growers in Central Illinois. Ernie became interested in turkeys when he realized there was a great demand for them, but farmers had a difficult time growing them to sell. To make a long story short, Ernie read some research by Dr. Billings at the University of Minnesota. In this research, Dr. Billings found that turkeys, usually raised along with chickens, almost always became infested with a disease called "Blackhead." The disease rarely affected the chickens. His research concluded that chickens harbored the disease and passed it on to turkeys.

Ernie experimented by raising a small flock of turkeys that were kept away from chickens, which was much more involved than it sounds. By the 1930s, Ernie was raising several hundred turkeys, which soon were in demand for Thanksgiving and Christmas. About 1935, "Tremont" and "turkey" became synonymous, and the high school team was nicknamed "The Tremont Turks." That was when Ernie donated uniforms to the team with the insignia "Tremont Turks". Since then, the team has officially been known as "The Turks."

So, that Turk mascot at our ballgames has a story behind it - of an enterprising farmer who found a way to raise turkeys successfully, which in turn gave rise to the Tremont Turks/Turkey Festival town of Tremont today.

Senate Bill 28 and Senate Bill 1947

Earlier this year, Senate Bill 28 was reinstated (after being omitted by lawmakers when Senate Bill 1947 was passed), forcing schools all around Illinois to make schedule changes.

Senate Bill (SB) 28, or the 5 clock-hour rule, is nothing new; however, in 2017, Illinois passed a bill to change the way they fund schools. It is called evidence-based funding (EBF), also known as Senate Bill (SB) 1947.

The bill was created so that underprivileged schools can get up to par. However, this plan has led to the majority of Tremont's funds being taken away by the state and left to come from local sources.
