### **District 702 Early Childhood Screening**

Tremont School District #702 will be holding an Early Childhood Screening on Thursday, August 22nd.

All children ages 0-5 living in District #702 are eligible. This is not a Turk Center or Kindergarten Screening. The purpose is to screen developmental levels in motor skills, general knowledge, social skills and speech/language skills in order to access the need for special education services. Further evaluation may be recommended.

Have you ever tried to picture Tremont's depot as an actual busy train station? The depot today is a vibrant, active spot, just in a much different way than it used to be!

But just for a moment, use your imagination to step back in time. Imagine people not driving up for coffee, but standing in line to buy train tickets. Horses and buggies would be wing for choice spots to unload their luggage in the early days, replaced by automobiles as time marched on. Freight was loaded and unloaded there. Imagine the piles of baggage, the telegraph operator receiving and sending messages of joy and grief. Can you see the people waiting patiently or impatiently for their train to arrive? Maybe they are greeting a loved one, or leaving for a day of shopping in Peoria, or maybe a theatrical group is arriving to do a show at the Columbia Opera House.

When every last train ceased operations in the 1980s, the track was taken up and the building had no purpose. How fortunate we are that this building was not destroyed or left, sagging and abandoned, a sorry reminder of days past. Instead, the people of Tremont honored history while moving forward with a new vision.
