Winter Weather Safety

There will always be unavoidable traffic accidents, especially during the wintertime. However, some simple prevention tips could stop a tragedy before it happens.

Safety should always be a concern while driving, but you should be especially aware and safe during the winter. Ice is possible on the roads, making it more crucial than ever to be careful when driving.

It may seem like a difficult task and not worth your time, but winterizing your vehicle is something that the Illinois State Police Department recommends as found on the ISP site.

"It is especially important to get it winterized to avoid any unpleasant or dangerous situation while traveling in frigid weather."

There are certain parts of your vehicle you may want checked, especially if the vehicle is older. These include the ignition system, fuel system, brakes, and tires, among many more. While this may seem like a grueling and pointless task, there is no price too high to ensure that you are staying safe along with the people around you.

Another good tip the Police Department has to offer is to keep your gas tank as full as possible to prevent the tank from freezing.

"Keeping your tank as full as possible will minimize condensation, providing the maximum advantage in case of trouble."

Always make sure that you are driving safely and defensively, especially when the roads are slippery. It may seem to be a safe road, but when it is cold there is always a chance of ice.

While it will definitely help to be prepared and try to prevent an accident from happening, it is also good to prepare for any unavoidable tragedies that may occur.

"A Citizens Band (CB) radio and/or cellular phone can be very useful to you or another stranded motorist in case of an emergency."

In the case of an emergency, try to stay in your vehicle if possible, especially when it is cold. Stay where it is warm and call for help if you are stuck.

Make sure to remember, safety is the most important thing when driving. Not only your safety, but the safety of the people around you as well.
