1917 News in Tremont

Recently, we discovered two especially interesting articles from a 1917 issue of *The Tremont News:* Titled, "A Thing of Beauty," the first article describes the light fixture in the far left of the photo below: (Note: The date on photo must be incorrect)

"The new traffic and ornamental pillar being erected at the corner by the First National Bank* is sure a thing of beauty. The cluster of five lights on top are as useful as they are ornamental. The center light will burn all night while the corner ones will only be used of evenings."

Also in 1917, the "horseless carriage" was a novelty that was becoming more and more popular. An excerpt from an article in the same issue shows just how new the driving of autos really was:

"All those with automobiles might just as well begin to practice keeping to the right, also in parking to the right as a little later a regular traffic ordinance will be passed by the village board such as is in vogue in the cities. If you begin to learn now it will be easy to comply with the rules later."

*In 1920, that would be Perdue's Grill.
