## Did you know...?

#### **Tremont's Nationally Renowned Actor**

"Louis James was one of the greatest Shakespearean actors of the gilded age." Louis Leavitt James was born in Tremont, and he spent his early years here. He was from a line of prominent men. His grandfather, Josiah James, was one of three men who founded Tremont in 1835. One of Josiah's sons was Benjamin Franklin James. Benjamin's son was Louis. Louis' father, Benjamin, was an attorney and elected county judge in 1849. Apparently, he had ties to Abraham Lincoln and Todd Lincoln was said to be Louis' boyhood friend. Benjamin moved his family on to Chicago when Louis was young, then on to Washington, D.C., where he was a U.S. Patent Office examiner.

Louis served in the Civil War, then turned to acting in 1864. He joined a Shakespearean troupe, traveling from one town to another to perform, earning high praise for his talented portrayals of the Bard's characters. His career took off.

In a vintage edition of a local newspaper, a Tremont resident tells of being on a train and recognizing another passenger, Louis James. The man said the two had a good conversation on their train ride and Louis commented that he had fond memories of Tremont and still recalled where many things were located in town.

It was probably easy to recognize Louis, for he was on his way to becoming very famous. He was six-foot-tall (above average for the time), handsome, and had a deep, rich baritone voice. Louis James became a household name, a nationally renowned star. In his 48-year career, it is estimated that James gave approximately 9,000 performances. He died suddenly in 1910 in Helena, Montana, as he was preparing to perform Henry VIII the next evening.

Every major newspaper from Los Angeles to Boston ran his obituary.
