Some Things Never Change

From the Tazewell Whig, January 10, 1845

To the Tax Payers of Tazewell County,

The undersigned would respectfully recommend a general meeting of the citizens of Tazewell country, at Tremont, on the 18th day of January, 1845, to take into consideration measures for reducing the salaries of the State Officers and members of the Legislature, and to urge upon the Legislature the necessity of immediately adopting some means calculated to wipe out the stigma at present resting upon our State in relation to her indebtedness.

Some prominent Tremont men who signed include Nathan B. Kellogg, J.L. James, Issac Leonard, H.L. Pratt, A.H. Staltonstall, Benjamin F. James, G.F. Staltonstall, and others as well as several men from the county.

Illinois became a state in 1818.

Notice is hereby given that on Monday, August 17, 2020 at 6:45 p.m., a public hearing will be held by the Village of Tremont Village Board at the Village of Tremont Village Hall, located at 211 S. Sampson St., Tremont, IL 61568, for the purpose of considering and hearing testimony regarding a proposed Annexation Agreement between the Village of Tremont, Illinois and Midwest Equipment Business Properties, LLC.
