Did you know...?

Our Civil War Drummer Boy

The Tremont Museum is in possession of several original Civil War letters and some transcriptions of

others. Copies of some of these are part of the veterans area at the museum.

"The Tazewell County boys were encamped near Tremont. We enjoyed visiting...they were jubilant and anxious to move on to action," wrote Tremont resident Eugenia Jones Hunt. It is likely that one of those boys was a drummer boy from Tremont Township, Dewitt Warner. He was the 17-year-old brother-in-law of one of our prominent Civil War-era residents, Colonel William Lackland.

In 1862, then Captain Lackland raised Company A of the 108th Regiment in which many Tremont men enlisted, including his wife Cordilia's three brothers. One of Lackland's letters to his wife carried worrisome news about DeWitt and another of her brothers, Hiram:

"Memphis, June 18, 1864

Dear and ever respected wife. It is rumored, but not believed that part of our men were taken prisoners near Corinth. They have not been heard from for several days. Hiram is still on the city on duty. DeWitt went out with the regiment."

In his following letter, Lackland wrote, "31 are missing from our regiment. Nothing has been heard from DeWitt..."

Unbeknownst to his family and regiment, DeWitt had, in fact, been captured by Confederate soldiers. When he was captured, he smashed in the head of his precious drum so the enemy would not use it, but they actually ended up allowing him to keep it.

Dewitt was taken to Andersonville Prison in Georgia, known today as the worst of the worst war prisons. The conditions were deplorable and by the end of the war, 14,000 prisoners had died of starvation, disease, and lack of shelter there. After Dewitt had been there six months, a prisoner exchange was held. DeWitt's name was not on the prisoner list because the Union Army believed he had been killed in action. But when the name was called of someone who had recently died, DeWitt took his place and was freed

He arrived at the Army headquarters, where he was fed, cleaned up, and given a new uniform to replace his rags. Someone kindly replaced the head of his drum with new calfskin. He was then sent home on a 30-day furlough.

His family had been told he was dead. When DeWitt came home, skeletally thin, his dad thought he was seeing a ghost. Needless to say, after his horrible experiences, DeWitt came home a changed man, boyhood long left behind.

DeWitt Warner married Myra Hampton in 1869. Together they had five children. He was a storekeeper and farmer in Allentown. He and his family moved to Kansas in 1885. Until his death in 1930 at the age of 85, his most prized possession was his battered drum.



The Village of Tremont Village Board will hold a public hearing on October 5, 2020 at 6:45PM at the Tremont Village Hall, 211 S. Sampson St., Tremont, Illinois, for the purpose of considering and hearing testimony regarding a proposed Annexation. Agreement calls for the annexation of approximately 25.6 acres of vacant land located just east of Chestnut Street near Lee Street and Margarete Street (part of PIN 12-12-19-400-014), the rezoning of the property, once annexed, to the R-1 Single Family Residential District and matters relating to the development of the property.
