The Village of Tremont Village Board will hold a public hearing on October 5, 2020 at 6:45PM at the Tremont Village Hall, 211 S. Sampson St., Tremont, Illinois, for the purpose of considering and hearing testimony regarding a proposed Annexation. Agreement calls for the annexation of approximately 25.6 acres of vacant land located just east of Chestnut Street near Lee Street and Margarete Street (part of PIN 12-12-19-400-014), the rezoning of the property, once annexed, to the R-1 Single Family Residential District and matters relating to the development of the property.



#### Did you know...?

#### **Improvements Needed In Tremont**

"The Inkspot" was a newspaper published by Tremont High School students years ago. The following is from an English assignment - an essay on "Improvements Needed In Tremont," by then student, Harold Blue. His essay was published in the October 27, 1927 issue.

"Tremont would surely be benefitted if it should be connected with neighboring towns by hard surfaced roads, and if the main streets should be paved, but I do not think we are quite ready for such a radical change just yet...Improving City Park is sorely needed. The park, which used to be the pride of Tremont, has degenerated into a hayfield. It would also be nice if a public swimming pool and wading pool would be installed."

Besides apparently being a visionary, Harold Blue went on to graduate from Tremont High School and he later worked in railroad and aerospace engineering. He was also an editor in California. His father, Frank Blue, was a well known pharmacist in Tremont for 40 years.
