Did you know ...?

Winter of 1836 "Sudden Freeze"

It is said that the weather changed instantly. So much so that chickens, hogs, and cattle froze to their spots and could not move until they were cut free. Not all could be cut free.

It all started on a pretty normal-seeming December day in 1836. Central Illinois saw four inches of snow, and at sunrise, the temperature was 40 degrees, turning the snow to a drizzle, causing slush everywhere. Then a dark cloud pushed in at 25-30 mph (some said at hurricane force) and witnesses said there was a "terrific, deep, bellowing sound." And the northwest wind brought a bitter cold wave, almost instantly dropping the temperature to 0 degrees. (Some said -30).

People in the fields nearly froze before they could find any shelter. One story is of a man whose coat blew open and froze that way, so sudden was the freeze. But it was the travelers on the prairie who fared the worst.

Tales are told of people being frozen to their saddles and having to be removed, saddle and all, to thaw before a fire. One gruesome story was documented by one of the men involved. James Hildreth from

Vermillion County and another man by the name of Frame were traveling across the open prairie to Chicago when the sudden change hit. Desperate to be warm, the men killed one of the horses, gutted it, then huddled inside. When the warmth was lost, they tried to kill the other horse, to utilize in the same way, but the knife dropped in the snow and could not be found. Frame died, and James Hildreth was found, having lost all toes and fingers except one thumb. Several others out on the prairie froze to death.

To this day, there has never been a central Illinois weather event like the "Sudden Change" or "Sudden Freeze" in 1836, and meteorologists still have no explanation.
