Did you know...?

Two Tremont Boys Hit Pay Dirt

The exhilarating excitement, the possibility of striking it rich, and the spirit of high adventure spurred a few Tremont residents to sell everything and become "Boomers". Exaggerated rumors of the gold mines' plenty in Nevada caused many a young man from our area to pack up and head west to join the rush.

The McQueen boys of Tremont were two who joined the "Boomers" headed to Nevada. Gold miners were referred to as Boomers because they would descend on tiny settlements where gold had been discovered and cause an explosion in population. One such town, Goldfield, Nevada, consisted of just a few tents when gold was discovered. Almost overnight the town grew to be the largest city in Nevada, 18,000-20,000 strong.

Those who took the risk of investing all they had also risked influenza and pneumonia (called the "black plague") and other epidemics, diseases, homicides and suicides that flourished in boom towns.

Some were successful, others were not. The article below is from the Tremont News in April of 1907:

"In a letter Thursday morning from a friend in Utah, we learn that the McQueen boys, Ben and Dave, have struck it rich in a mine in Nevada. They, in company with a Mr. Williams, owned fifteen claims which are paying so well that the McQueens bought Williams' one third interest, paying him \$5,000 for it. By a clipping in the White Pines Times we see where the deeds were recorded last week. One claim that Dave has owned separate from the others has cleared \$7,000 in the last three months. The boys are former residents of Tremont and we are glad to hear of their good fortune."

In the early 1900s, \$1.00 was equivalent to approximately \$28.00 in 2013. The average yearly wage was \$432.00. An average home was \$5,000 and a steam-powered car cost \$1,000. So, it appears the McQueens did quite well with their venture.

By WWI, those mining camps were ghost towns, and their wild days of gold rushes became a thing of the past, leaving only memories of the high excitement and risk those boomers, including two daring Tremont boys, experienced.


