Notice of Public Hearing - Amendment to Zoning Code

The Village of Tremont Zoning Board will hold a public hearing on May 27, 2021 at 7 P.M. at the Tremont Community Center, 216 S. Sampson St., Tremont, Illinois, concerning a proposed amendment to the Village's Zoning Code. Only one accessory structure shall be allowed on a residential property in Districts R-1a, R-1, R-2a and R-2. The size of the structure shall not exceed three percent (3.0%) of the property size. One additional gazebo or pergola will be allowed with the same size constraints as the accessory structure. The gazebo or pergola may have a knee wall not to exceed 36 inches in height measured from the floor. The gazebo or pergola shall not be enclosed and shall not be used for storage. Did you know...?

Tremont and The Underground Railroad

Many who live in Tremont today do not realize the important role Tremont played in the Underground Railroad. Many are puzzled as to why the Underground Railroad was even needed here – after all, Illinois was a "free state," and slavery was illegal. That is true, but the Fugitive Slave Act of 1850 prohibited people from aiding slaves in their escape to Canada. The reasoning was that slaves were the property of their owners and must be returned to them. It is estimated that between the 1820s through the Civil War, over 800 slaves were helped to freedom in Tazewell County alone.

Slavery was illegal in Canada. Several routes through the northern states were established to help runaway slaves escape. Those who were "conductors" helped the slaves move secretly in the night from one "depot" to the next. A depot might be a home, barn, or even the woods. The historic "Red Brick" home in Tremont (still standing) was one such depot, owned by conductor John Albert Jones. A trap door is concealed in the floor of a bedroom, leading to a crawl space where people could hide if needed. Codes were used to alert the escapees or the conductors, such as bird calls, lit lanterns in windows, and ribbons tied in trees. Coded language was also implemented, such as a "package" to arrive soon, or a certain response to a question asked.

There were a few routes that led through Tazewell County. Who organized each of these routes and the stops along the way remains unknown. Due to the secret and dangerous nature of the mission, specific documentation is rare to non-existent. What is known is all who participated, the slaves, and their "friends" were in constant danger.

Slave hunters sought escaped slaves for profit. Slave owners often offered large rewards for the return of slaves, but often the hunters took captured slaves to St. Louis, where they could be auctioned off for a larger amount. Of course, the law also was on alert. The Fugitive Slave Act held the federal government responsible for finding and returning slaves. Those who hid slaves or helped them move from station to

station did so at great risk and for no glory. In fact, they received no recognition at all for their efforts, even years later when they died, because assisting escaping slaves remained controversial for many years. Luckily, those committed to the goals of the Underground Railroad did what they did because they knew it was the right thing to do. But if caught, they faced a minimum of six months in jail and a minimum of \$1,000 in fines,

Tremont's known conductors were Josiah and Levi Matthews, John Albert Jones, Freeman Kingman, and Absalom Dillon. They will be honored in a first-ever event in Tremont as part of a series of events in Tazewell County. **Save the date of Saturday, June 12 - 3:45PM** in the front yard of Marc and Christie Bailey's historic "Red Brick" home, 412 E. South Street. The Tremont Historical Society is honored to host the Heritage Ensemble and a long overdue recognition and celebration of Tremont's courageous Underground Railroad Conductors. Parking and seating will be limited, bring lawn chairs if desired.
