Did you know...?

Matthew Baer

Prominent Early Tremonton, Utah Settler, Originally From Tremont, Illinois

Last week's article told of a group from Tremont, Illinois, who left to settle in northwestern Utah around 1901. Because they were mostly from Germany originally, and because they were Apostolic Christians whose church services were conducted in German, they were referred to as the "German Colony." They founded the town of Tremont, named after the town they had left. This group of men included Gideon Winzeler, Louis Getz, Henry Baer, Samuel Imthurn, Mathew Baer, and Jacob Meister, and their families

Just four years later, the post office felt the need to change the town's name to Tremonton to avoid confusion with the town of Fremont. After about ten years, a serious division in the world-wide Apostolic Church caused an irreparable split, and most of the former Tremont, Illinois residents returned to their former hometown. A few, such as Matthew Baer, remained.

An article from the May 10, 1923 Tremonton Leader paid tribute to Matthew Baer, one of the Tremont(on) founders, who had recently been killed in a freak car accident on the same day and time that his daughter needed emergency surgery. The paper referred to him as "one of the most widely-known and respected citizens in the northern part of the state." Baer was born in Baden, Germany and came to "the Peoria area (Tremont)" in 1896. He became manager of the several hundred acres of Sommer & Sommer farm interests just west of the city.

The Sommers were owners of the Keystone Wire and Iron Works of Peoria. Later, Baer used his engineering background to form the Baer Drainage Company, along with the Sommers. He had the contract for virtually all of the large drainage projects in the state of Utah. He was chief organizer of the Tremonton Products Company and was also president of Tremonton Cider Vinegar Company, Director of the Tremonton Telephone Company, President of Tremonton Dairy Products, and had served on the city council for four years.

A little over a year before his own death, he had lost his wife. They left behind thirteen children. According to his obituary, hundreds were expected to attend his funeral.

He was an original town founder who thrived in the area and left his mark forever on the town of Tremonton and the state of Utah.
