Did you know ...?

The Boot Scraper's Tale

There is a little-noticed humble boot scraper on display at the Tremont Museum. Its former home was just outside of the Tazewell County Courthouse in Tremont. It would have been a necessity in Tremont's early years. The 8th judicial circuit-riding attorney, Abe Lincoln, no doubt scraped his own muddy boots on it before entering the courthouse during rainy weather. And the rainy days were many in early years in Tremont.

1835, the year Tremont was founded, was the year of the greatest rainfall according to recorded history. The rain started falling in the early spring and continued though early summer that year. In the History of Tremont, Illinois (1925), Tremont Resident Millie Troll reports, "In the early part of July a storm of rain, thunder and lightning occurred, which for severity has scarcely ever been equaled...the great prairies, then uncultivated and undrained, were a vast lake, and fish were plenty in almost every locality. The storms would gather with fearful rapidity. A small cloud would be seen somewhere, and in a moment, so to speak, the deluge was on. The falling of the rain was frightful, the vivid lightning and crashing thunder were a terror."

"The consequences of this rain were dreadful. The earth was filled with water and every little hollow was a stagnant pool to engender disease. After the fierce storm demon had passed, a silent pestilence arose from among the green prairie and stalked restless among the inhabitants."

Somewhat similar to the Pilgrims of Massachusetts, who started their settlement of Plymouth in terrible conditions, those early settlers of Tremont had to deal with extreme weather conditions in their first years. For example besides the extreme rain and mud of 1835, the next year, 1836, was known as the winter of the "Sudden Change," when the temperature is said to have dropped 40 degrees in just a few minutes.

"The years 1842, 1844, and 1858 are also notable as years of great rain-fall," Troll continued. "During the early history of the county, when there were no bridges, great difficulty was experienced in getting from place to place in the spring-time on account of the high waters. At such times ferrymen were allowed to

charge double fare ... "

Roads and streets were dirt, so of course with the rain the mud was deep and travel on horseback, horse and wagon or buggy was nearly impossible. Walking across streets in town, women lifted their long skirts and dresses to ward off muddy hems. Sturdy iron boot scrapers, often attached to buildings or front steps, would have been especially valuable items needed to clean one's boots off before entering homes or businesses.

Once roads were paved and sidewalks were laid, the boot scrapers saw much less action, and today, many people never give that unobtrusive boot scraper in the museum a second thought.
