Rare Piece Has an Interesting Story to Tell

The generations of the Rapp Family, owners of Morton Pottery Works, had definite leanings to the right, politically. They created campaign G.O.P. elephants and ashtrays for Republican candidates, including Richard Nixon and Everett Dirksen. But there was one notable exception.

Some special pieces were made for the 1960 campaign of Democratic Presidential candidate John F. Kennedy. And there was a meaningful reason why.

During World War II, Gilbert Rapp, son of Samuel W. Rapp, served as a pilot for the United States Naval Air Service. He and John Kennedy's older brother, Joseph, Jr., trained together, became close friends, and, as co-pilots, flew bombing runs over Germany. In their book, *Morton Potteries:* 99 Years, Vol. II, Doris and Burdell Hall wrote,

"Gilbert was killed on March 31st, 1944, while on one of those missions. Later, Kennedy was also killed while returning from a bombing mission. In memory of his brother and the man who served with him, John Kennedy wrote a collection of tributes that he called, *As We Remember*. The Gilbert family was presented with an autographed copy of the limited-edition book. When John Kennedy was nominated for President, he had no problem getting orders filled for his campaign mementos by Morton Pottery Company."

However, the statuette pictured here was not for the campaign, rather it was a tribute. And it is rare. It replicates the iconic photo of three-year-old John-John Kennedy, saluting at the funeral of his father, President John F. Kennedy. Since the Associated Press photograph was copyrighted, the pottery was not allowed to continue producing the little figures. One of the few that were produced will be on display at the Tremont Museum during "The Morton Pottery Story" exhibit. This is one of the many pieces from the Elton and Helen Rapp collection, loaned by their son, Mark Rapp.

Water Main Flushing

Annual Water Flushing to take place the Week of October 17 - 21.

Water Main flushing allows any sediment and stagnant water to be removed from the distribution system and also provides an opportunity to test the operability of the hydrant.

During flushing, water may become temporarily discolored and customers should avoid washing clothes until the water has cleared. These steps are taken to improve the overall water quality within the distribution system and to ensure the delivery of the highest quality water possible.
