Innovation - Tremont's Houseboat Factory

One of the most unusual businesses ever located in Tremont was "Maid of the Mist," a houseboat building factory. Locating a business such as this on a lake or large river would not be so rare, but Tremont is about as landlocked as a town can be.

The two business founders, Dr. H.A. Evans and contractor LaVern (Jug) Stuber, enthusiastically embraced the novel idea back in 1959. Both men had been interested in boats for quite awhile. However, deciding to act on the houseboat idea was more of a business plan. Both believed there would be a good market for houseboats. They envisioned the convenience of not having to haul a boat through traffic to water for each outing, not having to find a nearby hotel, or any of the other inconveniences connected with recreational boating at that time. This was in the earliest days of the interstate system in Central Illinois. Most roads to the river were dusty or very crowded.

Dr. Evans had built his office in 1954 in the 300 block of South James Street. The 90' X 40' houseboat factory was built directly to the east behind Dr. Evans' office. Two models of quality flatbed wood and steel houseboats would be built, one 32' and one 22'. The plan was for their six part-time employees to build a boat per week.

Their boat cabins were fitted with every convenience, including a gas-powered electric refrigerator, a gas stove, a bathroom with shower, bunk beds, a table, hot water heater and plenty of storage.

It was an innovative idea. And so it came to be that it wasn't long before Tremont residents thought nothing of seeing houseboats on South James Street.

The Maid of the Mist Houseboat Factory closed in 1963. The building was purchased by Tremont Township.
