PEORIA'S TURN OF THE CENTURY CORN CARNIVAL

The red glass cup, with the gilded gold lettering, "Dear Mother," and "Corn Carnival 1903," piqued our interest. What was this little souvenir all about?

Finally having a moment to do some research on this museum artifact, it turns out that Peoria not only had a corn carnival, it had its own corn palace. Most people know about the famous Corn Palace in Mitchell, South Dakota, but who knew there was one in nearby Peoria, Illinois?

In all, around the turn of the century, there were 34 Midwest cities who could boast of having a corn palace. Peoria's began about the same time as the one in Mitchell. However, Mitchell's is the only one that survived, and is now a major tourist attraction.

Seating 7,000, the wooden, octagonal building was first built as a tabernacle for religious purposes. Then, from 1898 to 1902, it served as the home for the Peoria Corn Exhibition, or Peoria Corn Palace. Why our little red cup says, "Corn Carnival 1903" is a bit of a mystery.


The building's theme was corn, and all décor was corn related. The purpose of the Corn Palace and the Corn Carnival was to promote the area's corn products.

Peoria's Corn Carnival was a grand event, lasting a week in late summer. The festivities included music or jugglers at nine different corners in downtown, bicycle races, Ladies' Day, Governor's Day, concerts, husking matches, fireworks, agricultural prizes and a Grand-Masked Parade and Carnival.

Why it all lasted only four years is yet another mystery.

At the museum, we'll look at our little red cup differently now. Through similar experiences, we've learned that even the smallest artifact can yield forgotten, interesting stories!



Registration is open from 8/1 through 8/26 for 4th, 5th and 6th grade girls. Register at the Fitness Center Office during our open hours or online at tremontpark.org

FEE: \$100.00 - Fee is due at time of registration or the first week of practice. This fee goes towards the cost of patched officials, insurance, tournament fees and gym usage fees.

TEAMS - Teams may be combined. We may have two or three teams depending on numbers. We currently have two coach volunteers and will be looking for additional help. The coaches will be announced once the teams are divided.

GOAL - The goal of this program is to provide girls an opportunity to learn and practice the fundamentals of basketball in a structured setting and to experience basketball at a competitive level against other teams their age. Our goal is to prepare the players for junior high and high school sports. Keeping kids active and participating in team activities is essential. Youth sports develop confidence and character and allow kids to have fun. Keeping our youth together will prepare them to play together in junior high and high school.

INFORMATION - Home games are played at Tremont High School. Practices are scheduled twice a week at Tremont Grade School Gym. Our away games consist of traveling to our surrounding communities within a 25-30 mile radius. Approximately 15-20 games are scheduled for each team. Games are normally played on weekends.


