Did you know...?

A Young Soldier's Thoughts

The tree blossoms give it away - white, plum, pale pink, bright pink: spring is here. The air is soft and the sun's new warmth is treasured. When I see these signs, my mind goes to a letter kept at the Tremont Museum, written nearly 160 years ago by a young Tremont soldier. Thomas McClure had seen action, but at the time of the letters quoted here, he was confined first to a general hospital and then to a smallpox hospital in Memphis, Tennessee. With the terrifying and heartbreakng war, sickness, and death all around him, the young corporal wrote to his mother:

"Mother this flower I plucked from a tree in the cemetery on the fourth day of April, 1864. It is a French Peach bloom...and it was something that I had never seen before and perhaps you have never seen the like before."

His words create a clear image of the young man, contemplating the unusual spring blossom, and missing home and his family with his whole heart.

Spelling and punctuation have been corrected in these letters for clarity. Many letters preserved from this time, including McClure's, were full of misspellings and lacked proper punctuation. While it is likely that Thomas did not have much formal schooling, his intelligence and sensitive nature come through in his letters home.

In another letter he wrote:

"I am happy to say I am yet spared to see one more budding spring and see the forest spread forth its leaves in all its beautiful array."

Many do not realize that disease killed twice as many Civil War soldiers as wounds from battles. Smallpox was a huge issue. Over 12,000 soldiers in the Union army were admitted to hospitals due to smallpox and almost 40% of those who became sick with it died. A vaccination was available, but many feared having it. Still more, surrounded by the disease, tried to inoculate themselves. This was a very unsanitary process of cutting themselves and then infecting themselves with pus from someone else they thought had the disease. Having smallpox was no small worry.

Tremont's Thomas McClure did survive, did come home, and lived in Tremont to the age of 67. But while a soldier, survival was never a certain, as he expressed in one letter to his mother:

"Mother, in this letter I will send you a ring as a present made by your ever-remembering son. Not knowing how soon I might be called to my long home, you would certainly be happy to have some little present as a keepsake."

The Tremont Museum has several letters written by Corporal Thomas McClure, and several written by other Civil War soldiers from Tremont.


