From Hamburgers to Helping Local Farmers, Tremont FFA Members Deliver

On Thursday, October 12, Tremont High school FFA handed out meals to the farmers and their workers delivering grain to the East Plant. They distributed 100+ sacks full of burgers, chips, drinks, and homemade desserts at one of the local grain elevators (Tremont Cooperative Grain CO.). They also got to learn a little bit about what happens behind the scenes at the elevators.

This event was definitely laying our foundation for a mental wellness/help network initiative for Tremont community farmers, and their families. Did You Know...?

Tremont's Most Historic Home

Tremont's most historic house was built in the 1840s in the Greek revival style. This home is well-known in architectural circles. In Tremont, it is known by many names: The Underground Railroad House, The Redbrick, The Jones-Menard, and some refer to it still as The Wagenbach House.

Today the home, located at 412 East South Street, is owned by Marc and Kristie Bailey, who have been working over the years to restore it to its former self. They are fully aware of its remarkable history, though many in Tremont are not.

The home was originally built by John Albert Jones, patterned after a home he had owned earlier when he lived in Washington, D.C. It is described in The Architecture in the Old Northwest Territory by Rexford Newcomb in this way:

"Of sure classic lineage is the Jones-Menard house at Tremont, built in 1845 by John Albert Jones and purchased in 1866 by Peter Menard. It is a two-story brick edifice with pedimented ends and plastered walls. A small Doric porch covers the entrance which is on the long side of the building. There is a fine staircase of black walnut within the ample hallway; and in the rooms on either side are fireplaces of simple Greek lines."

A Peoria Transcript article from November 14, 1941 by John Drury of the Chicago Daily News as part of a series on old Illinois Houses states, "The façade of the house, whose faded red brick and white trim form a pleasant contrast to the dark pine (tree) shading, is distinguished for its simple dignified classical design. Here one finds the portico with fluted Doric columns as well as cornices and pilasters of the typical Greek revival house of the 40s. (1840s) The inside hallway contains a fine stairway of black walnut. Off the hall are large commodious rooms, each adorned with fireplaces in the classical style."

Abraham Lincoln was quite familiar with the Jones home. When he was a lawyer on the 8th Circuit Court of Illinois, he was a frequent visitor to the Tremont Courthouse, which at that time was the Tazewell County seat. He often stayed with his great friend, John Albert Jones. He stayed so often that one bedroom was dubbed, "the Lincoln bedroom." Jones was very political and held a Lincoln rally in 1860 at his home. At that event, 40 people dined in the large dining room.



The Peoria Heritage Singers performed outside of the Jones-Menard house during an Underground Railroad Recognition event in June of 2021, sponsored by Tazewell County Clerk, John Ackerman, in cooperation with Tremont Historical Society.

The home has a trap door in the Lincoln bedroom that covers a small crawlspace, and a trap door the leads to the roof. Because of these features, Jones' abolitionist views, and the location of the home, which at that time was in the country outside of the town of Tremont, it is widely thought that it served as a stop on the Underground Railroad.

The Tremont Museum has a display on the Jones-Menard House, including many more facts photos, and original floor plans. The museum is open 2nd and 4th Sundays from 2-4 through Dec. 10, when the museum will close for the winter.
