School Referendum Update

Annual Tremont FFA Alumni & Supporters Meeting Scheduled

The March 19th referendum for Tremont CUSD 702 will present voters with a question about whether or not they approve of an increase to the district's limiting tax rate from this year's 4.22% to 4.62% in 2025. As mentioned in previous updates, this increase coincides with a decrease in the district's bond tax rate, which means the overall tax rate will be lower even with the passage of the referendum. If approved, the increased limiting rate will generate revenue for the district for enhancing and adding programming for students and for addressing facility needs.

We often discuss tax rates, but one question that comes up quite a bit is in regard to how people's actual tax bills will be impacted. It's difficult to project future increases to property assessments, but the chart below shows projected tax savings compared to taxes paid in 2024 if property values were to remain relatively steady over the next few years.

As you can see in the chart, as the bond tax rate drops over a two-year period because existing building bonds will be paid off, taxpayers are projected to save on property taxes that go to the school district. Tremont already has one of the lowest school district tax rates in the area and that rate would drop further with the passage of the March referendum.

One of the particularly challenging features of this referendum is that there is no mechanism to include anything about the decreasing bond rate in the ballot language. As a result, the language used on the ballot will make it appear that the tax rate will increase. While the limiting tax rate will increase, the overall tax rate will drop because of the decreasing bond tax rate that occurs at the same time.

Future updates will address the ballot language issue in more detail, but it's worth noting that the language could be confusing to voters. The question will be presented on the ballot as a simple "Yes" or "No" question with a "Yes" vote signifying you support the referendum's passage and a "No" vote signifying you oppose the referendum's passage.

Public meetings will take place between now and March with the next meeting likely being in early-mid January. We will share information about those details once they are determined.

Did You Know...?

A Forgotten Tradition

It was a magical night. Cars, sans their headlights, crept stealthily up the lane. Carefully, people pulled over in the grass and parked, opening and closing car doors oh, so quietly. In hushed silence, each clutching some sort of bell, or pan and spoon, we made our way to surround the front of the house.

Then suddenly, on cue, pandemonium burst forth! Pans clanging wildly and noise startling, the silence was shattered. Lights flashed on and the front door swung open wide. The newlyweds had just been charivaried!

As a child, I was lucky to experience a charivari, because it was a custom that had died away a generation or more before. But some creative person had decided to resurrect the old event, creating a lasting memory for this child.

The dictionary defines a charivari (pronounced shiv-er-ee or shi-riv-er-ee) as a noisy, mock serenade performed by a group of people to celebrate a marriage... As in, "Friends gave them a joyous charivari, with much banging and bell-ringing." The practice actually used to happen on the couple's wedding night, in early days. Couples in the early 1900s were no doubt glad THAT practice had evolved!



The Tremont News at the turn of the century contains a few articles about charivaris. After the surprising, noisy serenade, it was tradition for the newlyweds to open their home and treat the revelers to some type of refreshment. For example, in December, 1913:

A.C. Schneider and bride returned Monday evening from a short wedding trip. The boys gave the newlyweds an old-fashioned charivari Tuesday evening. Gus gave the boys a handsome treat and everybody went home happy."

And, in October of 1919:

"Wm. Bolliger and bride have returned from their trip to California and the boys treated them to a charivari one night this week. Will was prepared for them and treated them royally."

A more elaborate event was planned by a group of women of the community in June of 1925:

"Mr. and Mrs. William Dietrich, who returned Thursday evening of last week from their honeymoon trip to Cincinnati, Ohio, were treated to a real old-fashioned charivari last Friday night, by a large number of ladies of this community.

"An old buggy was brought into service in which the bride and groom rode through the main street of town, and then then they were pulled to the home of Mr. and Mrs. L.B. Snider where the ladies were treated to ice cream."

What fun, happy memories for all involved!
