Did You Know...

Tremont's Painted History

Murals are created for a number of reasons; one is to record or memorialize history. They are often used to beautify public areas. For example, the nearby town of Pontiac, Illinois, has over 20 murals on buildings, most celebrating old Route 66. The town of Morton recently had a mural painted on the side of one of the buildings on Main Street, showing a scene from the town's past.

Did you know that Tremont has at least two murals, both Tremont-themed?

Eli's Coffee Shop features a Van Gogh–style mural depicting iconic structures in Tremont, such as the charming 1904 United Methodist Church, the Columbia Opera House building, the grain elevators in town, Pinky's Ice Cream Shop, and the mounted bell which rang at two early schools in Tremont – The Bell School and the 1892 High School on Harris Street. This mural was painted by Abbigail Ladwig, class of 2012 or 2013.

The second mural is at Tremont Grade School and was a high school advanced art class project around 2007 and 2008. Nichole Roller, Tremont High School art teacher, Jodi Peine, Tremont Grade School Principal at the time, and art students collaborated on the theme and layout. The mural spans both sides of the short hallway connecting the old and new additions.

This mural was painted over two years by talented art students and their teacher, and tells the story of Tremont's history, starting in Native American times and ending around 2007. Beginning with time before the first non-native settlers arrived and a tribute to early farming, the mural continues to more recent history. There is the scene of 1940s high school days, showing high school students at their hall lockers on a typical day. The Tazewell County Courthouse in Tremont, the "Red Brick" house, the 1904 United Methodist Church, the grain elevators, Pinky's Ice Cream Shop, Jerry Beecham and his grocery store, the early 1800s mounted bell, and the 1892 Tremont Community High School are also part of the story.

These murals are an important part of our community's history. As time has marched on, as it is known to do, several of the people and structures shown are gone. They will forever be immortalized, due to foresight and creativity. If the mural were painted today, what newer places and people might be added to inform those we have yet to meet?
