### Did you know...?

Probably the last person you would expect to find in the prairie land of Tremont, Illinois, would be a Danish pirate. But one did live here. His name was Hans Laus Turburg.

In an interview that appeared in the Peoria Journal in 1925, a long-time resident, Josiah Sawyer, spoke about Tremont's pirate. Turburg had come to Illinois to visit his brother and decided to settle in Tremont. Sawyer lived in the house on the north east corner of Tazewell and Harris Streets, which is still standing today. Across the street from the Sawyer house (no indication of the address) was where Turburg lived in a "little steep roof cottage."

Sawyer shared some memories:

"We children were very much afraid of him. I guess he was quite harmless when I knew him. He had married a seamstress and had two little boys. The story is that he was in the Danish navy and did something that wasn't just according to Hoyle. Then he became a pirate. A real pirate. His sea chests are in the Smithsonian Institute at Washington, D.C. today, so the story must be authentic. "

"That house of his was built in 1834. Not one of his descendants are living (in 1924). One of his sons was killed in the Civil War."

There are no pictures of Tremont's pirate, and no interview with the man. But thanks to another old man's good memory and a reporter's work back in 1925, we know he existed and lived here.


