
Did you know...?

Tremont has an historic train depot, today containing several shops which many of us frequent. The depot is a reminder of times when the railroad stopped here, and as many as three passenger trains, two freight trains and a local were filled.

But did you realize that the building we know is actually Tremont's second depot? The earliest depot stood at the south end of the Public Square (known today as City Park.) It was on the east side of S. Sampson Street, set parallel to Pearl Street (Rt. 9).

The photo is likely from the late 1800s. Visualize that early depot next time you are at that corner!


While the team will practice as usual this week, our swimmers will get a nice break from any Meets so they can enjoy time with family and friends. Happy 4th of July!
